The two main pieces of equipment needed for cricket include a bat and ball.

The official who enforces the rules in cricket is known as the umpire.

The role of the bowler is to bowl the ball at the bats person.

The name given to the player that stands behind the wicket is the wicket keeper.

A cover drive in cricket is when the batter hits the ball in front of the bats person.

The players that are trying to catch the ball are called fielders.

Getting bowled out is a way of dismissing the bats person.

If a fielder catches the ball without it bouncing on the ground the bats person is out.

The main objective of cricket is to score more runs than the opponent.

Protective equipment that is worn during a cricket match by the batter is a helmet and gloves.

Key Vocabulary

- ⇒ **Wicket** - the structure of three stumps and two bails at each end of the pitch.
- ⇒ **Official** - a person who enforces the rules during a match.
