•	The new variant has been found in our community but we are talking about single figures. This careful approach is about keeping the figures that low. Early evidence is suggesting that younger adults and children can be the mair carriers.
•	To help reduce the spread of the new variant we have been told that ANY CHILD DISPLAYING SYMPTOMS AROUND HAVING A COLD SHOUL HAVE A PCR TEST.
•	We fully understand the frustration this can create, clearly there are many col and coughs doing the rounds at the moment, but I am sure you would agree, that it is better to be careful than to risk the alternative.
•	Lateral Flow tests are good if you have <u>no symptoms</u> but if your child is displaying any symptom such as a cough, sore throat, temperature or sickness then they <u>must</u> have a PCR test.
•	There is still a question mark over the effectiveness of Lateral Flow Tests wit the very young. So this is another reason why PCR might be best if you have any concerns.
•	Always choose to go to a testing station rather than a postal test, as you may get your results back the same day or within 24 hours. Frustratingly for both you and the staff we are having to send numerous
•	pupils home daily, as the children are displaying symptoms but they still are being sent to school. Get them tested and if negative they can immediately return.
PC inf	u may be aware that there are plans for schools to be involved in distributin R tests. At the time of going to be press we have not received definitive formation but as soon as we do we will pass the information on. please keep checking your Parent Mail.
