As we slowly return to a new normal, you are provided with a choice for this terms parents evening. One night will be in school (Tuesday), one night will be through Video calls (Wednesday).

In School (Tuesday 5th April)

Meetings to take place in pupils classrooms. You will enter via the classroom from the outside door (except Year Five). No crèche, so no children to come to school. Parents to wear masks, as will teachers. There will be an opportunity to see pupils books in the meeting. Each meeting will last 9 minutes. If you have more than one child you should move to the second class via the outside of the school building.

Virtually (Wednesday 6th April)

This is appropriate if you cannot get to school or do not have child care. The opportunity will last 9 minutes. If you are late to the meeting you will not be able to gain entry. At the end of the allotted time the meeting will automatically finish.

Who can be a Brownie Guide? Any girl between the ages of 7 and 10.

Brownie Programme: What's the point of Brownies? The short answer is to have fun, build friendships, gain confidence and resilience through challenging activities; learning new skills while enjoying old favourites in a safe, girl only environment.

So what do we do? Through weekly meetings Brownies make new friends, develop life -skills, learn new hobbies, get creative and have outdoor adventures. There will also be an opportunity to go along to special events with other Brownie Units and to take part in sleepovers.

What is the cost? Brownies are run by trained volunteers, so we can keep the cost down to a minimum. There is an initial joining fee of £15 (after a month's free trial - this covers items such as the Brownie Badge book and other useful items) and then £10 a month to cover the weekly meetings.
