Covid has not gone away!

The school is cautiously hoping to return to some of our normal routines this academic year. For this to happen, we all have a role to play. Put bluntly, if you send your child to school with Covid and they give it to their teacher, the whole class will be sent home and learning will be more significantly impacted!

At present we are waiting for LA updated guidelines. In the meantime we continue to follow the existing guidelines that were adopted for the second half of the last academic year:

- If your child is showing Covid symptoms please keep them off and monitor.
- If possible please test them. If negative they may come to school.
- If positive, they can not come to school on that day (Day 0), they must then remain absent for another three days.
- If well and they do not have a temperature, they may return to school on Day Four.

Clearly we do want to place anyone, whether it is a child or a member of staff at an increased risk. We sincerely hope you will support the school with these actions.

School Dinners

I have been informed by County Catering that school dinners will see an increase to £2.30 a day, which is £11:50 for a full week.

Please remember that all meals must be paid for in advance on the Monday of the week by using ParentMail. (No cash payments will be accepted)

Reception, Year One and Year Two receive free dinners regardless of their parents financial position. Pupils of course can continue to have sandwiches if they choose.

Free School Meals

Parents and pupils entitled to free school meals no longer have to reapply, but must inform the authority if there are any changes in their circumstances. If you think you might be eligible for free school meals, **especially new Year Three parents**, contact the Customer Service Centre on 01926 359189.

Please remember we have an online payment facility for dinner money through the Parent Mail app. It is very easy to use but if you have any questions Mrs Barkby in the office is more than happy to talk you through the setting up process.
