

#### The School Day

The government white paper, "Opportunity for all: strong schools with great teachers for your child" set an expectation that all state-funded mainstream schools will deliver a minimum length of school week of 32.5 hours as soon as they can, and from September 2023 at the latest. And although the White Paper has now been scrapped there is still an expectation that this instruction will be introduced. The 32.5 hour minimum expectation includes the time in each day from the official start of the school day (i.e. morning registration) to the official end to the compulsory school day (i.e. official home time). The 32.5 hour minimum includes breaks and lunch times as well as teaching time and any extra-curricular activities that all pupils are expected to attend.

The governors and staff have been looking at options since the paper was published and would now like to give parents an opportunity to voice their preference.

To achieve the allocated time we have decided, that as a minimum, to make the doors opening at **8:50am** the official start of the day, with the expectation that all pupils will all be on site and ready to learn (**At the moment doors open at 8:50am but the school day does not officially start until 9:00am**). However, this will still leave the school 25 minutes short over the week, or 5 minutes short everyday.

So there are two options

- A) Increase the morning start to 8:45am. With an expectation that all pupils will be ready to come through the school doors at that time. The school day would finish at 3:15pm, as it does presently.
- B) Increase the morning start to 8:50am. With an expectation that all pupils will be ready to come through the school doors at that time. Increase the ending of the school day to 3:20pm.

A separate form to express your preference will be sent to you later today through Parentmail.

Please express your preference for either:

- A) 8:45am start. With a 3:15pm finish.
- B) 8:50am start. With a 3:20pm finish
- C) To express that you really do not mind and will be happy with whatever the school decides.

The survey will close on Friday 24th March.

The governors are hoping to make a final decision in April. The new times will then be introduced in September 2023.

We are very aware that with other school drop offs or work commitments this will not be ideal for everyone, but to repeat this is a government instruction that the school must adopt.
