Anti-Bullying Week

Next week in school, we are reflecting on bullying and why it happens as part of the National Anti-Bullying Week.

In school we will be looking at the difference between bad behaviour and bullying. In brief, bad behaviour is a one off incident, while bullying is something when an individual is repeatedly picking on someone else over a sustained period of time.

It is important that we all use the right terminology, so that when bullying is used in the right context it is not diluted by inaccurate use.

Needless to say both bad behaviour nor bullying is ever tolerated at Wembrook!
